### Who Will Serve Their Children Joshua 24:15

A pastor explained how Saturday was a day to get things done around their house because of work, family and church responsibilities. Just a few weeks ago he and his youngest son Jeff who is six years old had finished mowing the lawn and were putting things away. The pastor thought this would be a terrific opportunity to rest and spend a few minutes with Jeff. The two of them crawled up on the family's trampoline and gazed up into the blue sky. With a puzzled look Jeff turned and asked "Dad,...Why are we here?"

The pastor thought this would be great teaching opportunity so he explained how we are children of our Father in Heaven, how he has sent us here because he loves us and wants us to experience the things he has created for us, how he wants us to serve one another, to learn, to grow and to develop those qualities that will allow us to return to live with Him some day. The father paused and asked if that had answered his question. Jeff responded, "Not really". The pastor then began to think how else he might be able to answer the question when Jeff again asked, "Dad,...Why are we here?...weren't we supposed to pick Mom up an hour ago?"

As fathers we don't always remember everything we are supposed to do. In my particular case I can never remember which clothes go together in the washing machine. And sometimes our forgetting has disastrous results - like formerly white clothes now a shade of pink or what used to fit is now two sizes too small. But there are worse choices we make that can bring about eternal consequences.

Joshua, the leader who followed Moses said, "But if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you

will serve, whether the gods your forefathers served beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites, in whose land you are living. But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD."

On the cusp of the future of the nation of Israel Joshua calls for a confession of faith from the people. Will they declare their allegiance to the true God or not? The future of their nation and the eternity of each individual depends upon a good confession of faith.

June 21 is Fathers' Day this year. Fathers' Day is a day of celebration and thanks given to God for faithful and God fearing fathers. But, it also gives us opportunity for Christian men to be Christian men. That is, they are called to make a good confession of their Godly faith in a country, society and world whose gods are calling for a man's confession as well. If serving the Lord seems inconvenient, troublesome, a burden, a weariness, and not a pleasure and delight then choose the pagan gods you will serve- the ones in the country you live or the ones you served before you became a Christian.

Choose among those gods remembering that it wasn't those gods that saved you from your sins and it wasn't those gods that freed you from slavery and it wasn't those gods that blessed you with what you needed. Rather, it was the Lord God who created, purchased, redeemed, forgave, liberated, and filled you with the sure hope of everlasting life.

Confess the true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit to your family, your children and the world in which you live. Say, by actions, words and life, "But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD." Serve the Lord whether anyone else does or not.

The good confession of faith by fathers or mothers or anyone can be very difficult and the temptations strong to cave in to the pressures of others expectations. But it's just as critical for the future of our family and our country as it was in Joshua's day.

But you can make that good confession! Here's how -the Holy Spirit works through God's Word to create and sustain saving faith. "Therefore faith comes by hearing, and hearing through the Word of Christ." (Rom. 10:17). Let God have

His way with you through His Word. The choice to serve the Lord is not the product of human reasoning, decision making, or willpower. "God is the one who works in you, both to will and to work for His good pleasure." (Phil. 2:13).

John Wesley wrote, "They that are bound for heaven must be willing to swim against the stream, and must do, not as most do, but as the best do." Fathers YOU are the best hope for your country and your family.

The Spirit working through the Word makes God's people bold to confess:

"Then here will I and mine today A solemn cov'nant make and say: Though all the world forsake His Word, My house and I will serve the Lord."



Maintaining a healthy balance in our lives

"I feel like my job is consuming my life," said Karen. "I put in extra hours, worry about work when I'm away from the office and find it hard to take a vacation

without feeling guilty." Karen is not alone in her situation. Many people feel that a certain aspect of their lives is overpowering the other facets of their lives.

Throughout nature, you see that things have a certain symmetry to them. We see that balance in flowers, trees and even people's faces. When we write, we like to center our words on the paper. We place a bouquet of flowers in the middle of a table. It is pleasing to the eye to have things equal on each side of that imaginary dividing line.

When we speak about the balance of nature, we refer to the fact that too much or too little of something throws everything off. Too much rain means floods, soil erosion and plants that decay from all the moisture. Too little rain results in droughts and plants that wither and die. Fortunately, nature is forgiving and allows a little bit of leeway.

Our lives are also about balance. Too much or too little of any one thing can throw our lives out of kilter. Working long hours without a break, such as a vacation, a day off or even an hour off is not healthy physically, mentally or emotionally. As in nature, it can throw off that delicate ecosystem known as our bodies.

Keeping things in balance isn't just about work. We can overdo or minimize things in just about every aspect of our lives. Having fun, watching TV, exercising, spending money and keeping relationships are all things which we can have too much of or too little of.

Our bodies cannot operate on continuous overload. We can't drive a car at 100 miles per hour, day in and day out, without necessary maintenance. We can't expect everything to function at age 40 the way it did at 20.

Pace yourself and be attuned to those little warning bells and whistles that signal it is time for a break/time for maintenance and put balance back into your life.
