PASTOR'S LETTER

“Fake News” - have you heard of it? Wikipedia has defined it as, “Fake news is a type of yellow journalism that consists of deliberate misinformation or hoaxes spread via traditional print and broadcast news media or online social media. Fake news is written and published with the intent to mislead in order to gain financially or politically, often with sensationalist, exaggerated, or patently false headlines that grab attention.” President Trump and legitimate news agencies have spoken on the subject and how dangerous it is because it leads people to a false sense of truth. “False Truth” might be a better word for it. And while “false truth” is dangerous for people here, it can be cataclysmic for people eternally. That’s why it’s important to get “truth” from a reliable source.

The Bible (John 16:13) tells us, *"But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all truth."* God says the Holy Spirit is the unquestionable authority on truth. And when God says something there is no higher court of appeals. There is no higher authority, no more respectable expert than the truth of God found in the Bible and revealed to us by the Holy Spirit.

Not listening to that truth is harmful. You will hear so called “truths” on Facebook, Snapchat, in emails received and from so called experts that there are no absolutes anymore - that nothing is right or wrong but rightness or wrongness is determined by the situation. This premise has led to a country not sure whether same sex marriages are right or not, whether abortions should be performed or not, or whether God’s name should be erased from the money we use or the constitution we follow. Many people simply don’t know anymore what’s right or wrong like St. Paul the Apostle writes in Romans 1:25, *“the world exchanges the truth*

for a lie." It comes down to either hold on to the truth or face the consequences. The authority above all authorities says frankly in His Word (Romans 2:8), *"But for those who are self-seeking and who reject the truth and follow evil, there will be wrath and anger."*

Yet, the Holy Spirit through the Gospel and the Sacraments, offers truth. The eternal, unchangeable truth of the highest authority- God Himself speaks to us through the Holy Spirit. This is absolute truth, unchanging through the eons of time, without qualification or condition. It's so pure and righteous and it extends so far beyond our thoughts and ways that we can't comprehend this truth without help. The disciples needed help also. Jesus told them in John 16:13, *"I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. But when He the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all the truth."*

If you are wondering if there is anything besides "false truth" (false news) out there then go to the Holy Spirit and let Him speak to you through the Holy Scriptures. In the Holy Spirit we have a reliable guide to the truth that gives eternal life. Let the Holy Spirit guide you into all truth.

THE LORD IS "MY" SHEPHERD AND "YOURS"

One of the best known and beloved psalms is Psalm 23, the Shepherd Psalm. There we learn that the Lord is our shepherd. And since He is our shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

How do we do this? We do it when we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving the gifts that He won for us on the cross, a violation of the First and Third Commandments. We do it when we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we think we don't know what the future will bring, even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters. We do it when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves, we do this because we have a mind set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We do this because we have stopped hearing the call of our shepherd, which comes through His Word.

The Word of God is how our shepherd calls us to himself. Through that Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through that Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead you to your true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the good news: The Lord is your shepherd still, even, and especially, for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the shepherd that lays down his

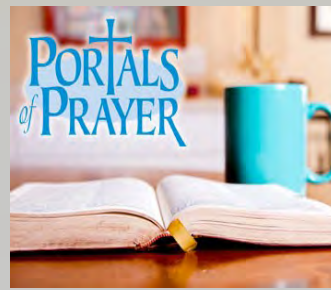
TRUSTEE'S REPORT- Did not have a meeting.

OUR SYNOD IN MISSION IN KAZAKHSTAN

Since 1991, communist repression of religion in Kazakhstan under the Soviet Union has given way to greater religious tolerance. In 1993, the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod began work in Kazakhstan and has since established the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kazakhstan.

In 1995, the LCMS began support of ELC mercy work with a grant that provided health services for those living in a fishing village. Through these kinds of relationships, built from LCMS projects, LWML grants and partnerships with other LCMS ministries, many doors have been opened to witness to the Lord’s great love through acts of mercy.

Currently, LCMS support of the ELC includes:

- New Ministry Starts
- Conference and Worship Facilities
- Handicap Institutional Reform
- Christian Resource Materials (LCMS provides expertise and funding for the translation, printing and distribution of Lutheran materials in English, Russian and Kazakh)
- Support of LCMS Personnel

Other LCMS partners in Kazakhstan have included: Bethesda Lutheran Communities, Concordia Mission Society, Lutheran Heritage Foundation, Lutheran Hour Ministries, LWML, MOST Ministries, and Orphan Grain Train.

The ELC is presently comprised of six congregations, seven ordained pastors, numerous small groups and various individual men and women who are receiving training in Lutheran doctrine and worship.

Family Essentials Kit #2 - Trust

When we go to the doctor for a checkup or to have them help us with something that is wrong we trust that he/she will be able to alleviate the pain and fix the problem. Most people believe that this trust is just freely given; however, trust is built from many components. In order to build a strong family, trust is an essential part, especially in terms of primary caregivers. When children lose faith in those watching over them, they may turn to others who don't have their best interests at heart.

The first and most influential relationship for a child is with his/her primary caregiver(s). This relationship helps him/her formulate how other relationships will look in the future. Enabling a child to realize that family has his or her best interest at heart helps him/her feel secure in facing struggles and confidence in his/her ability to succeed despite future challenges.

ESSENTIAL KIT ITEM #2 – TRUST

WHAT IT IS – Trust is confident expectation of something, which is formed through the understanding of the other person's knowledge, integrity, ability and actions. We trust doctors because they obtained knowledge in their schooling; through their actions and performance we trust that they will be able to help, and if not that they will be honest about it and send us to someone who can.

HOW IT WORKS – Trust works through the use of unconditional love and intentional, consistent and genuine behaviors. It has to be worked at and if you break someone's trust it is a long process to earn it back. Yet, when you have formed trust in a relationship you are able to reach a deeper level of understanding.

WHAT IT LOOKS LIKE – When trust is formed, you see safety amongst one another. Children are not left wondering when or if their parents will be there for them, and the family in general has less anxiousness or worries about each other.

Trust is built with consistent acts. Consistency is needed in a routine, so when you are more intentional in your routine, trust can be further developed and optimized. Trust is a necessity in order for unconditional love to be openly received. *Watch for next month's Item #3, Family Routine, as we show you the importance of how beneficial a routine is to families.*

You and your family do not have to struggle alone. LCFS counselors help families generate hope and cope with life's challenges.
