

GOD'S JUSTICE FOR US IS JESUS

Dear Friends of Holy Cross, this month of October we do a lot of remembering with some of the biggest American celebrations right around the corner. Secular and sacred celebrations like Halloween, Thanksgiving and Christmas soon will overwhelm our thoughts and empty our pocket books. But in contrast, not nearly the hype is reserved for Reformation Day, October 31. Reformation Day is kind of forgotten. Who sends a text or email message, much less mail a card to their friends and relatives with the words, "Happy Reformation Day"? Who buys gifts to exchange and puts them under a model of the Wittenberg Castle door complete with 95 theses written in German? Who invites others over for a Reformation dinner? Is Reformation day even printed on your calendar? Clearly, the world doesn't exult in this day.

Does the world have it right by ignoring this festival day? Are all we are doing here then just acting out an old tradition... remembering a dead reformer named Martin Luther ... and on Reformation Sunday participating in a yearly ritual devoid of any present meaning? If so, then let's stop it right here and now. We have more important things to do then relive a time of the middleages. We have more pressing needs- like bringing justice to our land. After all, many people feel that justice is not happening in America. Violence and shootings predominate on Twitter's breaking news with notifications, if we let them, popping up daily to remind us that evil has its sway and often the evil doer gets away with it. What can the Reformation begun in 1517 have to do with any of this?

People today are crying out for justice. But all many see is a wrathful God. They hear of highway snipers, feel the pain of losing loved ones to cancer and hear of yet other terrorist murders. They see thousands of war refugees. The world watches and wonders- where is God, where is justice? What possibly, could the Lutheran Reformation have to do with this?

Here's part of the connection. Luther himself felt the pressure of somehow connecting a merciful God with a just God. Luther wrote, "But I felt that before God I was a sinner with an extremely troubled conscience. I couldn't be sure that God was appeased by my satisfaction. I did not love, no, rather I hated the just God who punishes sinners. In silence, if I did not blaspheme, then certainly I grumbled vehemently and got angry at God. I said, 'Isn't it enough that we miserable sinners, lost for all eternity because of original sin, are oppressed by every kind of calamity through the Ten commandments? Why does God heap sorrow upon sorrow through the Gospel and through the Gospel threaten us with His justice and His wrath?" Luther hated these words from the Bible, "There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God," (Romans 3:23). So, even if it is to be admitted that God is just- then that leaves us all facing the same wrath of God and we are no better off for we are all sinners.

But God sent to us a heavenly Reformer- one who would reform the sin broken connection we have with God. He would at once be the victim and the priest. The injustice of God's wrath would be meted out upon His body and soul. He could have complained that it's not fair that He- the pure, innocent, holy Son of the most high God should have to suffer and be crucified for condemned mankind. But Jesus Christ didn't, because He and the Father's will was the same- to make God's pardon of sinful man just. As our text states, "all are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus." (Romans 3:24)

Justified by grace through faith alone in Jesus Christ has to be the very best words we have ever heard. We rejoice in St. Paul's text, "But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe." These words mean no more attempting to get right by our feeble actions - no more frustration in meeting God's perfect requirements, that we can attain to the glory of God through faith and faith alone in Jesus Christ. We have forgiveness and victory over Satan and sin through faith alone. We are certain inheritors of the heavenly kingdom through belief in Jesus Christ alone. Later, Luther would write how much this understanding of God's justice meant to him. He said, "I exalted this sweetest word of mine, "the justice of God," with as much love as before I had hated it with hate. This phrase of Paul was for me the very gate of paradise."

I join with you in this month of October thanking God that he truly is for you and for me, a just God. I join with you in trumpeting to the ends of heaven our praise to the Lord for this great truth. But I also challenge you, as well as myself, to a renewed determination to spread as far and wide as possible the knowledge of this God, and the salvation that is ours through faith in Jesus Christ alone. Spread that Word until, like Martin Luther, and like thousands of other believers who have gone before, we too finally join the great throng of believers gathered before the throne of the Lamb who say, "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive ... honor and glory and praise" (Rev 5: 12).

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES HILITES

- A motion was made and approved to accept the June minutes.
- <u>PASTOR'S REPORT</u> A graveside memorial for Mary Tumas was officiated by Pastor Bergman, and Eleanor Thiel's funeral was conducted by her daughter's Pastor. George Meyer was welcomed into membership on June 28.
- <u>TREASURER'S REPORT</u>- Tom had to borrow \$2,000 from the Working Cash Fund and the same amount from the NEM Fund. The Food Pantry Fund is doing well. So far \$550 of the VBS fund will be transferred to the General Fund for the next month (VBS expenses). A motion was made and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report.
- <u>ELDER'S REPORT</u> A motion was made and approved to hold a Funeral Education session by Blake & Lamb on Wednesday September 16 at 7pm.
- <u>EDUCATION REPORT</u>— The 2015 VBS had more children than last year, a total of 67. Daily attendance was 47 (37 families). 28 members volunteered and Barb is thankful to them. 70 people attended the picnic (staff & families). This year \$700 was donated by members (last year \$563). The Yard Sale fund raiser total was \$828.01. The Stewardship classes start Sept. 8.
- <u>TRUSTEE'S REPORT</u>- A motion was made approved to pay no higher than \$750 for the parking lot work.
- <u>SOCIAL MINISTRY REPORT</u> For a thank you to all the food pantry volunteers Pat wants to hold a Sock Hop in September. Five new families came on Saturday (total 25 families). A motion was made and approved to hold a Sock Hop on a Friday starting at 11 or 12 noon in September.
- <u>NEW BUSINESS REPORT</u>- Conceal & Carry was discussed. The Southwest Lutheran Chorus will be starting up again and a list of instructions will be given to them.
- The next Council Meeting is September 14 at 7:30pm, the next Voters' Meeting is September 20.

How might you have unconsciously conveyed your own fears or communicated the message that the world is a scary place?


Reassure your children by letting them know that they will be safe and protected. Here are some ways you can help them cope with their fears and convey reassuring messages:
